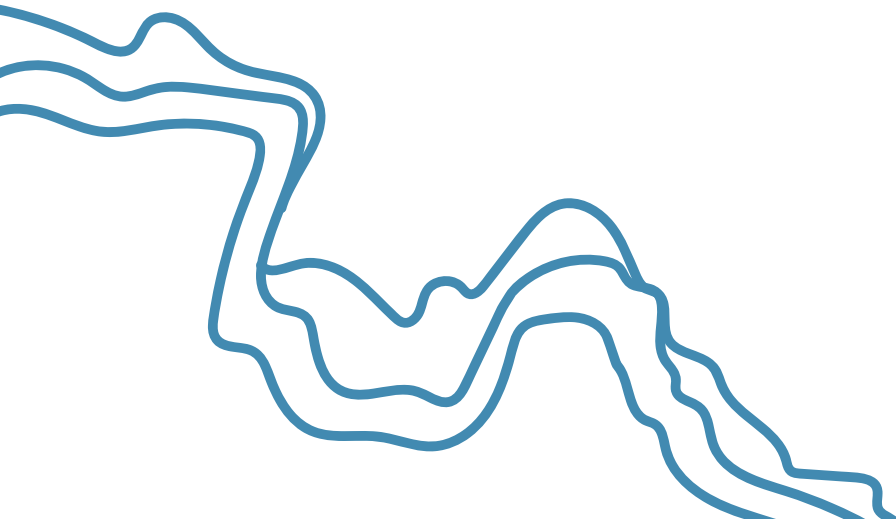

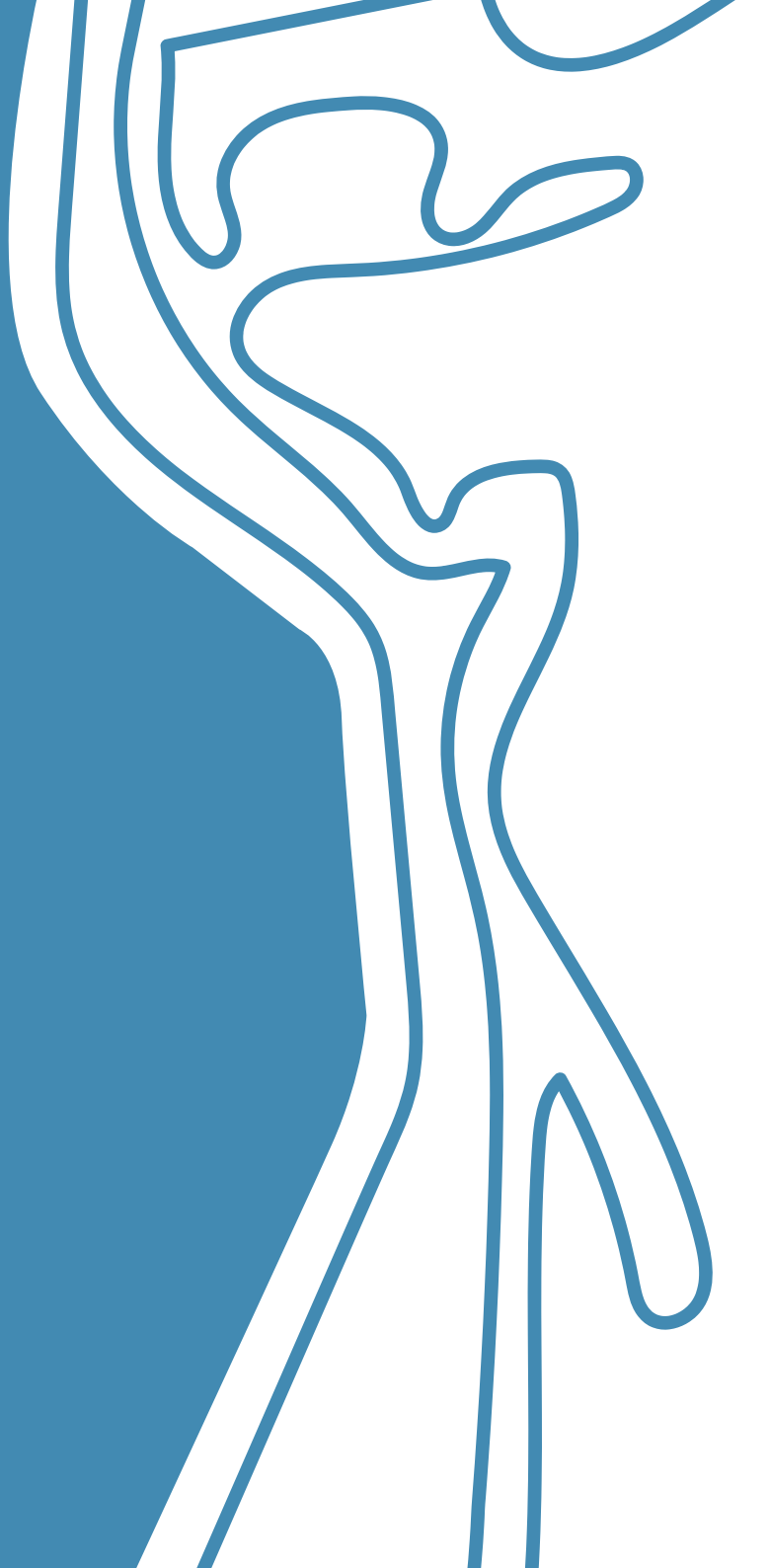

Mandurah Plein Air Artists (Inc) was established in 2011.

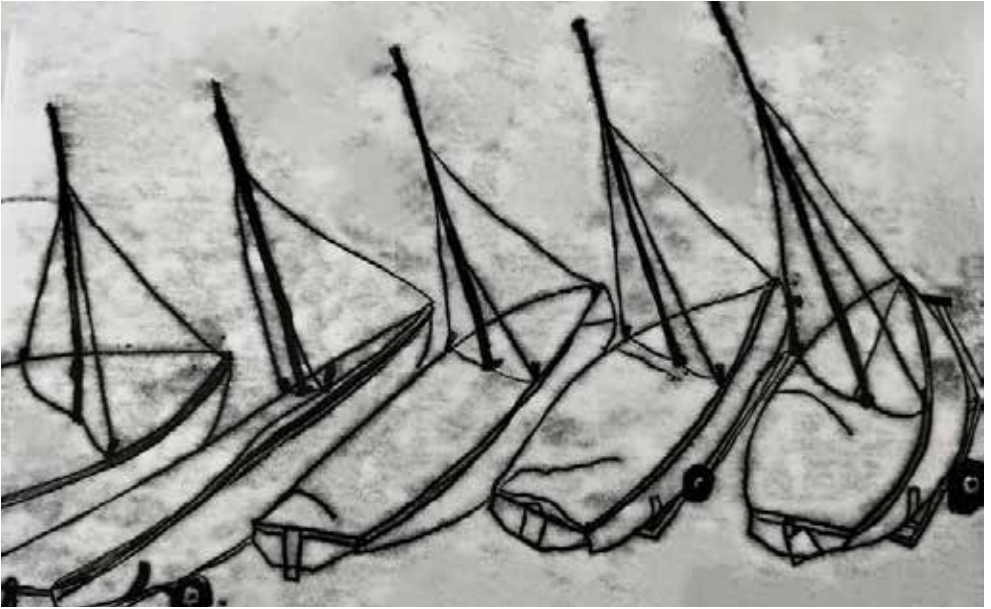

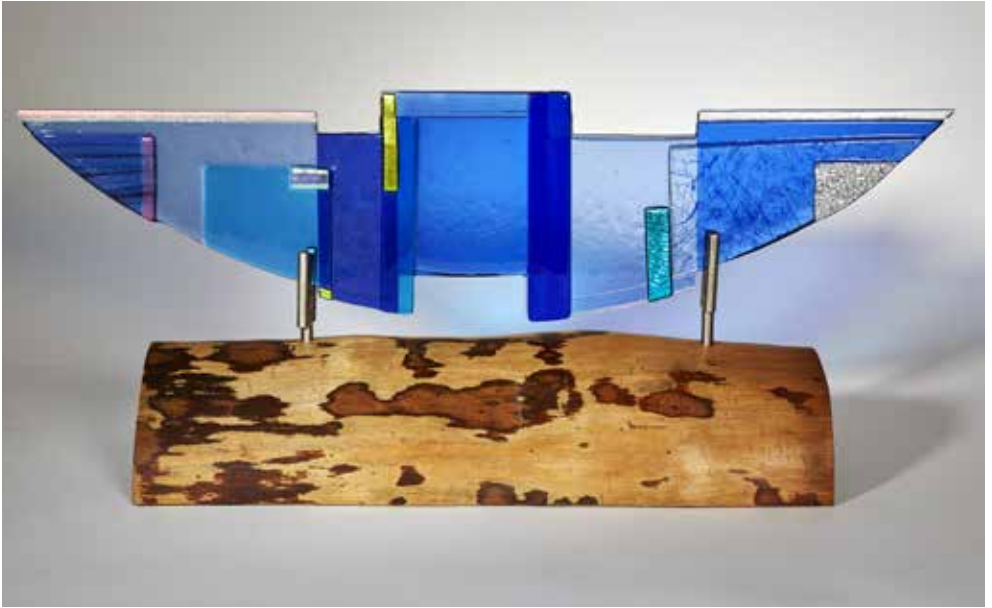
Deborah's art is a response to landscape, described as 'captivating and bold'. Her work mixes earthy tones against pop tones creating a dialogue that explores connection to land.
